Entries are limited to sixteen images, eight prints and eight projected images, from any one high school, and any one student can enter no more than two prints and two projected images.

We are proud to announce that during these 7 years we have been awarded a Best of Show, 2-1st Places, 2 - 2nd Place, 1-3rd Place, 2 - Honorable Mentions, & countless acceptances for the annual exhibition.
